#### PURPOSE

Pain reliever / fever reducer

#### USE(S)

- temporarily relieves minor aches and pain due to :
- backache
- headache
- menstrual cramps
- minor pain of arthritis
- muscular aches
- the common cold
- toothache
- temporarily reduces fever

#### WARNINGS

Allergy alerts: Ibuprofen may cause a severe allergy reaction, especially in people allergic to aspirin.

- are age 60 or older

- have 3 or more alcoholic drinks every day while using this product

- taking a blood thining (anticoagulant) or steriod drug
- under a doctor's care for any serious condition
- taking aspirin for heart attacks or stroke, because ibuprofen may decrease this benefit of aspirin
- taking any other drug

# WHEN USING THIS PRODUCT

- take with food or milk if stomach upset occurs
- long term continuous use may increase the risk of heart attack or stroke

## STOP USE AND ASK DOCTOR IF

• you feel faint, vomit blood, or have bloody or black stools.

These are signs of stomach bleeding.

- pain gets worse or lasts more than 10 days
- fever gets worse or lasts more than 3 days
- stomach pain or upset gets worse or lasts
- redness or swelling is present in painful area
- any new symptoms appear

Ask a health professional before use. It is especially important not to use ibuprofen during the last 3 months of pregnancy unless definitely directed to do so by a doctor because it may cause a problems in the unborn child or complications during delivery.
